As we move forward into this new year, I want to remind you of several Network resources available to pastors, members, and churches in the North Central Baptist Network. These resources exist as cooperative means through which our Network churches help one another as they strive to make disciples for Jesus Christ for the glory of God.

- Outreach Trailer This trailer comes loaded with a bounce house, cotton candy machine, snow cone machine, and all the other gear your church needs to spice up their VBS or hold a community outreach like a block party or fall festival. Reserve early to secure your desired dates. Info and application can be found at <u>https://</u> www.ncbnetwork.org/ministries.
- Utility Cargo Trailer This 6 ft X 10 ft enclosed trailer can be used for transporting luggage and gear for your church or youth group as they head out for youth camp or go forth on a mission trip. - Luis & Raquel Salazar International Mission Trip Scholarship – Are you, or someone from your church, going on an international mission trip this year? If so, you can apply for this scholarship to help with the cost of the trip. Recipients chosen for this scholarship will receive awards that cover up to half of their trip's cost. The application <u>deadline is April 15</u>. Scholarship application and info can be accessed at <u>https://www.ncbnetwork.org/</u> <u>scholarships</u>.

- John & Paul Barnett Fund for Missions Scholarship This scholarship opportunity differs from the Salazar one in that it is for people going on a domestic mission trip. But like the Salazar, a scholarship award from the Barnett Fund will cover up to half of the recipient's mission trip costs. <u>April 15 is the deadline to apply</u>. Check out <u>https://www.ncbnetwork.org/scholarships</u> for this application as well.
- Dr. Larry Orange Equipping the Called Scholarship – This scholarship is for our Network pastors and church staff members who are attending school at SBTS, Boyce College of the Bible, or Clear Creek Bible College. Each year our Network will award a \$1000 scholarship (or possibly two \$500) to the individual chosen from among the applicants. Here again, the <u>deadline to</u> <u>apply is April 15</u> and the application can be found at <u>https://</u> www.ncbnetwork.org/scholarships.

Last year, these scholarships were a blessing to six mission trip volunteers and two church staff members furthering their education and ministry skills. The trailers were a blessing also as numerous churches put them to work in their local communities. Newsletter Article January 2024

Your Church Health and Leadership Team (CHL) has been prayerfully discussing a variety of ideas for strengthening our Network churches in 2024. As a reminder, the CHL team is "responsible to assist churches in assessing church health issues including suggestions for promoting healthy practices." We have a couple of opportunities to share with you as we begin this new year in the Lord.

But before we get to those, let's quickly reflect on Acts 17:24-25. Paul is preaching in Athens and says, "The God who made the world and everything in it, being Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in temples made by man, nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mankind life and breath and everything."

It is important for the CHL team, and all our Network churches, to be reminded that God does not need us or rely on us for healthy churches. Growth, transformation, and health among our churches does not happen because *we* come up with the right strategies and church health opportunities. Healthy churches are not man-made, they are God-made. What a blessing and relief to know that "he himself gives to all mankind life and breath and everything." So, it is right, good, and necessary to work toward healthy churches, but we rely on God for the transformation in and through our people.

Our first opportunity of the year will be a Roundtable Shoptalk focused on the topic of men's and women's ministry. The Roundtable Shoptalk events are designed for us to learn from one another in our Network churches. We will gather at Highland Baptist Church on Tuesday, January 30th at 6:30 pm and divide into groups of men and women. Pastor Dan Reid (FBC Shelbyville) will facilitate a conversation concerning men's ministry and Phyllis Platt (Highland) will facilitate for women's ministry. Our desire is not to lecture on how to do men's and women's ministries, but rather we are creating space for us to learn from one another. This is open to anyone interested in men's and women's ministries, and I hope to see you there on January 30th.

Second, the CHL team is working to produce an Easter devotional for the month of March written by Network church members and pastors. This devotional will be available through online digital means, and we are hoping to also provide a physical copy to each Network church. We hope that will be an encouragement to you leading up to the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.



What is the Eliza Broadus Offering for State Missions?

Thus, as one of its earliest advocates and missions pioneers, the Kentucky State Missions Offering is named after Eliza Broadus. Miss Broadus served faithfully in her church and worked diligently and tirelessly for Kentucky Woman's Missionary Union. She held many positions for WMU on the state and national level. Her collective service to WMU totaled to fifty-three years from 1878-1931.

In 1913 Miss Broadus led Kentucky WMU to promote the taking of an annual offering for state missions in all the churches. In 1975 Kentucky WMU voted to name the annual state missions offering in her honor starting in 1976.


