"Early last year, one of my first clients as a Peer Advocate came to ALC for a pregnancy test. The test was positive. She did not want to be pregnant and was adamant that she would get an abortion. She agreed to an ultrasound, but our nurse was unable to find a heartbeat on the baby, which was measuring well past when a heartbeat should be found. Even though the client had stated she wanted an abortion, you could tell by her body language she was disappointed when she heard the news. We gave her instructions to see her doctor immediately, and she left. We attempted to follow-up by texts and calls but never received a response."

Harry Hebert – or 'Brother Bear' as he is date, and they have been together in more commonly known - is the pastor of Christiansburg Baptist Church, where he has served since 2016, with the support of his far smarter and much more beautiful wife, Robin. Together, they have raised three daughters who have each married wonderful men that Harry and Robin consider sons, and have provided five 'Littles' (two biological, two fosters and one in heaven) that allow Harry and Robin to fulfill their highest calling as Pop and Gran.

Harry grew up in South Louisiana Cajun country, the first Hebert in his family raised speaking English as a primary language. He likes to say that others may have been lucky enough to be born in Kentucky, but more than forty years ago, he was smart enough to choose to call the Bluegrass home. As a result of living in Kentucky for more than four decades, he no longer speaks French or for which he is deeply English very well. His deepest motivation for staying in Kentucky after attending the University of Louisville, was meeting Robin Franklin, who persuaded him to attend Clay Village Baptist with her in order to get a second

church almost every Sunday since then, as they will celebrate their thirty-eighth anniversary this year.

Harry's journey to ministry cut a wide ecclesiastical swath that imprinted in him a high view of Scripture as the inspired Word of God, a deep love of the Church as the Bride of Christ, and a passionate belief that the gospel not only saves people, but is powerful enough to transform their lives here and now. 




