We will use simple elementary level science projects to teach Biblical stories and to share the Gospel. We will need people to lead in music, games, and to make snacks. Christmas On Mission.

- 23** When He got into the boat, His disciples followed Him.
- 24** And behold, there arose a great storm on the sea, so that the boat was being covered with the waves; but Jesus Himself was asleep.
- 25** And they came to *Him* and woke Him, saying, "Save us, Lord; we are perishing!"
- 26** He said to them, "Why are you afraid, you men of little faith?" Then He got up and rebuked the winds and the sea, and it became perfectly calm.
- 27** The men were amazed, and said, "What kind of a man is this, that even the winds and the sea obey Him?" *-Matthew 8:23-27*

Does this seem like a strange passage to choose for a Christmas newsletter? I thought so too! But this is exactly where God is leading my heart.

God called His disciples to go on mission and to live on mission. While trying to live out their calling to follow Jesus, they found themselves in a violent storm. They are crossing the Sea of Galilee in a small boat. Suddenly, a big storm arose, creating large dangerous waves that could have capsized their boat at any moment. The Disciples were frightened! But Jesus was not. He was sleeping peacefully. When the fearful disciples woke Him, He asked them, "Why are you afraid, you of little faith?"

Jesus's question was loaded with truth bombs intended not only for the disciples, but for us.

Truth Bomb # 1 Have you forgotten Who is in the Boat with you? Jesus was in the boat with them. Jesus is in the boat with us as well. Why are we so afraid to step out on faith to God's call to live on mission. Missions are fun, if it is safe. But what about when storms arise? God never promised there would be no storms, only that He would ride in the boat with is through the storm.

Truth Bomb # 2 What are you afraid of? What a question! I believe the greatest obstacle the American Church faces is fear. We seek comfort, safety, and security above all else. But Jesus has called us to proclaim the Gospel in places that are uncomfortable and dangerous. He promised to be our security.

This Christmas, let Jesus be your ultimate example of missional living. God looked down at the earth and saw a mass of sinful humanity with no hope of salvation. A world that was uncomfortable, and dangerous. Seeing this, God's heart was broken. He was moved with compassion. So, He sent His One and Only Son. Immanuel- God with us. God in human form. He died, so we can live. THAT'S LOVE!
